The language of the gift is not, as we might expect, a mark of hostility to the market so much as a means of giving form to the 'society' in market society of representing everyday experiences of exchange that the myth of the free market works, even now, to render unthinkable.

The extension of a collective agreement generalises the terms and conditions of employment, agreed between organised firms and workers, represented through their association(s) and union(s), to the non-organised firms within a sector, occupation or territory. The collection of chapters in this volume are about the extension of collective agreements as an act of public policy.
